7	Equity Core Team	 From Janice Townsend and Eric Sanchez: Guest Townsend introduced herself as the Professional Learning Facilitator Guest Sanchez introduced himself as the Student Equity Planning Coordinator Was a goal to have people from all walks of life, managers, faculty, students It was a goal of theirs to include managers, faculty, and students in attempting to make action happen. "Last year was a funky year politically with Trump; [it] seemed like everywhere we turned, there were issues such as undocumented students or Black Lives Matter." Ended this point by stating how 6 students who were a part of their group have graduated last year with only 2 students left. Needs to figure out how to recruit more student members, as 2 students are not enough. Their question is how to recruit more, but the bigger issue is "more closely linked to what students want for equity." Guest Townsend continued that for instance, they never solved the holiday policy in which they debated how they should decorate the college during the holiday season. Reported that "people noticed that we stopped decorating," when she stated that they ultimately decided not to do anything at all Used De Anza College as an example of a "great model" for this. "You see equity everywhere." Thinking of doing an equity walk where every space is intentional. Gave the example of "pull up a blanket and have a lunch with friends" designated section Continued that they are not sure how to map things out, but one idea is to have a student group then have equity representatives come visit Guest Townsend reiterated that, "we are here today to pose the question: how do we make systemic change?" "It tackles how we can make the environment a safer place for all cultures, celebrating multiple holidays each month. Also setting up office hours in the quad where students can come up and talk to us one on one
			about personal issues they are having, not just academically." Guest Townsend responded that she worked closely with the former LMCAS president, Israel Cortez, last year with issues but there was some conflict with his schedule. In her opinion, she "definitely thinks" that after visiting to De Anza College, "you see how institutionalized and sterile we are here." Also thinks "we need to take on something more concrete rather than going with something too broad." Guest Townsend mentioned another initiative being started called "Guided Pathways" where they try to group like-minded majors where someone can take courses either way for a
			student undecided in a general field. "The goal is to ensure they do not take courses they do not need," she reported. "It reads that for many students, choosing the right major can be challenging, or that students have much access to support but may not be aware of them, and that students prefer to see the same counselor who can specialize their needs." Believes the current system of counseling is "silly" and ineffective as counselors cannot set up their own appointments, making for a system that is "too centralized." Looking to recruit a few students toward this as well
