LMC is pleased to report a significant drop in the number of students enrolled in pre-collegiate courses. The implementation of accelerated pathways in both Math and English, combined with the implementation of new utilization of multiple measures assessments, have resulted in more accurate placements of students. We are also pleased with the continued upward trend in the increase of degrees and certificates awarded. While it appears that the number of transfers has declined in 2016, the total being reported this year does not include transfers to In-State Private or Out-of State institutions. These transfer numbers are not yet available. However, when comparing CSU & UC transfer numbers from 2014 to 2016, LMC transfers have increased from 481 in 2014 to 512 in 2016.
