


Guiding Principles

Framework for functional review and recommendations:

- Vital to have a structure that fosters creativity, optimizes functionality, and positions the College for responses to opportunities and challenges
- Maximize organizational capacity
- Emphasis on institutional needs and themes
 - Identify efficiencies
 - Determine areas of alignment
 - Manage and streamline workflow
 - Reduce redundancies and improve organizational performance
 - Encourage cross-college collaboration to address issues and develop solutions
 - Strive for holistic approach to operations
 - Avoid "silo-effect"/fragmentation of services
 - Maximize diminishing resources
 - Enhance organizational effectiveness (accountability)
 - Support and promote student success




2011-12 Structure






Current Structure

Process

- Review current Mission Statement and revise (if necessary)
- Focused on the internal, but informed by the external
- Create opportunities for engagement and input from campus community
- Task Force established by SGC, with all constituencies represented

<u>Survey</u>

- Conducted online; solicited feedback from campus community and external community partners
 - Shared via email, website, Facebook, and Twitter
 - Sent to all LMC personnel, District colleagues, students (via InSite), and 200+ community members
- Received 366 responses



Group	Response Percentage (Count)
Students	57.4% (210)
Faculty	17.8% (65)
Classified	12.6% (46)
Managers	4.6% (17)
Community Members	4.4% (16)
Other/Decline to State	3.3% (12)
TOTAL	100% (366)
