Fire Certificates and Degree

Certificate of Achievement in Fire Technology

This certificate may be earned by completing 21 units of required Fire Technology courses in addition to completing competency requirements in English, Math and Computer Literacy with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher.

Certificate of Achievement in Basic Academy

This certificate may be earned by completing 15 units of required Fire Academy coursework plus the College Associate Degree requirements. Consult a LMC counselor to help plan the steps to complete this degree.

Associate of Science Degree in Fire Technology

This degree may be earned by completing 21 units of required Fire Technology courses plus the College Associate Degree requirements. This degree can lead to positions with greater responsibility and advancement. Consult a LMC counselor to help plan the steps to complete this degree.

College Skills Certificate in Fire Academy

The LMC Fire Academy is fully accredited by the California State Fire Marshal's Office. It is an 18-week condensed program designed to introduce, exercise, update and improve the individual job skills necessary to work in the field of firefighting. Prerequisite requirements include successful completion of at least nine units of Fire Technology courses AND a valid state EMT certification (LMC offers a one-semester EMT program). The Firefighter Academy certificate, plus employment as a volunteer or full-time firefighter is required in order to apply for a State Firefighter I Certificate.
