

LMCAS College-Wide Committee Representation List

1. Shared Governance Council (SGC)

A participation of a mutual deliberation by the college Senates, Associated Students, the President, and the management team regarding the plans of the college. The Shared Governance Council will spend its time and energy on high level issues that could include future regional needs, new program commitments, existing program contractions, program eliminations, and financial planning.

Additional examples of significant issues include approval and modification of the Master Plan and LMC Foundation's relationship to the college.

2. District Governance Council (DGC)

To provide a forum for strengthening the participation of representative groups to meet, discuss and debate issues of District-wide concern while acknowledging the autonomy of the individual Colleges and respecting the role that training, education, and experience play in individual influence and participation. This committee works to influence District-wide policies and procedures by making well-informed decisions and forwarding them as recommendations to the Chancellor and/or Governing Board in accordance with operational procedures. This committee meets off campus.

3. Institutional Planning Committee

Program Review/Planning Process, perform self evaluation, review other institutional planning processes, update six year institutional planning calendar, support the accreditation process, and recommend a process for updating the Educational Master Plan.

4. Technology Advisory Group (TAG)

Technological Advisory Committee (TAG) is a sub-committee of the Shared Governance Council (SGC). TAG revises the technology plan, identify key issues in technology, review the technology survey and establish goals and provide the info to the SGC.

5. Curriculum Committee

Curriculum Committee is a sub-committee of the Academic Senate, which has primary responsibility for making recommendations in the area of curriculum and academic standards as stated in the Education Code and Title 5. The following “academic and professional matters” delegated to the Academic Senate apply directly to the primary charge of Curriculum Committee: Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites and placing courses within disciplines, degree and certificate requirements, grading policies, educational program development, standards or policies regarding student preparation and success.

6. Distance Education

The Distance Education Committee (sub-committee of SGC) supports and facilitates the planning and delivery of the college's distance education program. The Distance Education Committee for LMC supports and reinforces the understanding that online learning is an integral part of the college framework that promotes learner success through innovative, interactive teaching, learning and technology. The Distance Education committee is committed to providing for all learners and promoting student success in both traditional and non-traditional learning environments within LMC's diverse community.

7. Institutional Development for Equity and Access (IDEA)

The Los Medanos College, Institutional Development for Equity and Access (IDEA) will facilitate coordinated and organized action to shift diversity, equity, and inclusion from the periphery of the college's activities to the center of the institution's mission, programs and policies. IDEA's analysis of college data such as student, faculty and staff characteristics, retention, success, persistence and goal

achievement rates (degrees, certificate and transfer) determined areas in need of critical attention. The areas of concern focus on three points: (1) conditions of academic success amongst African American and Chicano/Latino students; (2) student leadership and engagement; and (3) development of shared language amongst LMC professional community on the issues of diversity, equity and inclusion.

8. Teaching & Learning Committee (TLC)

The Academic Senate approved the Teaching and Learning Committee, a collaborative project of the Senate, administration and student services, charged with coordinating assessment efforts at the college. Coordinate college-wide assessment/professional developments efforts with the goal of improving teaching and learning. The TLC will be responsible for coordinating and assisting the work of the following committees: Developmental Education, General Education, Occupational Education, Student Services, and Library and Learning Support Services.

9. Campus Safety Committee

The Campus Safety Committee addresses college safety issues, such as its emergency preparedness plan, accident prevention, safety training and facilities inspections.

10. Sustainability Committee

The Sustainability Committee addresses college's conservation of resources, such as water or electricity, use of green facilities, reduce/recycle/reuse of materials, and in general, lessening the impact of our daily activities on the environment. There should be a cultural change to be less wasteful.

11. Professional Development Advisory Committee (PDAC)

The Professional Development Advisory Committee coordinates professional development activities and assists in the planning, implementation and evaluation of related activities. These include Flex activities, technology training workshops, conferences, seminars, some grant opportunities and other professional enrichment functions. The purpose of LMC's Professional Development is to *strengthen and support* a dynamic learning environment that promotes and enhances the personal, professional and organizational development for all staff.
