n innovative pilot program called Teaching Excellence Internship (TEI) has been implemented this year to attract talented faculty who reflect the increasing diversity of our students, and possess the sensitivity to the needs of the students served by the District. The goal is to hire and retain new faculty from the internship talent pool.

There are two project coordinators of the TEI program: retired LMC faculty member Dave Nakaji is the intern coordinator and retired LMC faculty member Janhavi Stewart is the mentor coordinator. Both are responsible for the formative and summative evaluation of the entire program as well as activities involving either mentors or interns.

"I believe this is the first time the District has offered a program like this, "says Nakaji. "We held an orientation and conducted weekly training seminars to give these aspiring teachers a great foundation in teaching strategies. The program is giving these talented folks the tools to be wonderful classroom leaders."

In addition, the program also recruited and matched interns with tenured faculty for mentoring relationships. Faculty members were selected and assigned to an intern to serve as a role model and coach: CCC's Jon Celesia and Nader Sharkes, DVC's Patrick Leong, and LMC's Mara Landers and Maria Tuttle.

Judging by their comments, the TEI program gave the interns an experience they will never forget.

4CDLI Advanced Training

The Chancellor's Cabinet designed a professional training and development program called Contra Costa Community College District Leadership Institute-Advanced (4CDLI-Advanced) to enhance the capabilities of the District's leadership team. Up to 20 mid-managers were accepted into the program that focused on how to ensure student success; human resources management; the intricacies of state, district, and college budgeting (finance) and enrollment management; and District and college governance and decision-making.

At a recent seminar led by senior dean of district educational programs **Richard Livingston**, the cohort focused on the strengths and weaknesses of shared governance as practiced at the colleges and in the District. Participants

also explored the managers' role in a shared governance environment, and discussed effective skills and strategies in leading teams.

"Everyone understands that working in a governance environment has its challenges," says Livingston. "It sometimes can be frustrating because it may take a little longer to reach consensus, but we must remind ourselves that when it is working effectively, it moves the entire organization in the right direction."

"I think the notion of training new leaders, whether you are a dean, department chair or committee chair is a good one," says San Ramon campus dean **Kathleen Costa**. "It's great to have managers meet and get to know each other, discuss issues, and share ideas and solutions."

Participants of the 4CDLI-Advanced program have already completed a Budget/Finance and Enrollment Management seminar along with this Shared Governance workshop. Still to be completed this academic year are sessions on the Manager's Leadership Role in Student Success, and Human Resources Management and Union Contracts.
