Montemayor shared the LMC major pathways list. 4 primary pathways: 1. Health, Behavioral Science & Social Science 2. Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics 3. Business & Management 4. Art, Humanities, & Communication All documents can be found on the LMC SEM page under Reports & Resources. N. Trager asked in the chat-"I see the pilot program called out, but not the design lab, is that piece included inherently in this document?" T. Maxwell responded- "@Nicole. The Work of the Design Lab Team reports through the ISSR workgroup." N. Hannum stated that we have our 4 pathways, pilot program, etc. but how do we bring it all together and next steps.
