8	Dr. A'kilah Smith Interim Vice President of Instruction Dr. Smith will present on Cal-GETC and Common Course Numbering.	Dr. Smith	1:45-2:00	Dr. A'kilah Smith – two of the most recent course regulations are Cal-GETC (California General Education Transfer Curriculum) and Common Course Numbering. Oral communication is not part of IGETC. Courses need to meet new standards; Languages Other Than English: now a graduation requirement for UC; Area E: not equivalent in Cal-GETC; Area 3: required 3 courses under IGETC, now 2; fewer total units than IGETC: 11 courses and 12 units. Students impacted: New students enrolling Fall 2025 and forward, students coming from UC or other institutions without Title 5 catalog rights, students who are continuously enrolled prior to Fall '25, but elect to follow Cal-GETC. LMC's Cal-GETC Implementation Plan: need feedback Intro to Common Course Numbering: AB 1111 establishes that the CA community college system will adopt a common course numbering system for all general education requirement and transfer pathway courses. The Chancellor's office and ASCCC are working together to develop common templates that include: aligned course

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				<p>prefixes and numbers, common aligned elements in: course description, pre-requirements/advisories, objectives, and content, optional areas for local necessary content. Working on common course numbering, phasing it out. All students next fall will see, instead of ENGL-100, for example, ENGL C1000. Used a numbering system to see most popular classes. Implementation plan implemented by task group, would love to have student input on common course numbering! Will not affect transcripts. The articulation is staying the same. Plugged an Academic Support Task Group talking about a model for Academic Support. Our current model is decentralized, but a centralized model is being talked about. Again, they would love student involvement!</p>
