He brought a procedure to the Shared Governance Council, who then said to share it with each of the senates and get feedback. The Opioid Overdose Epidemic is a huge national issue – there is a wave in deaths that started in the 1990s, and the dramatic rise has happened in the last 10 years with synthetic drugs like fentanyl. Services has done incredible work cutting the number
of prescriptions that doctors were writing – the number
has been cut in half. Even then, the rates of deaths are
still going up, especially in the last 3 to 4 years. People
anywhere from 20 to 50 have died the most. There is a
California Standing order that allows community
organizations and other entities, including colleges, to
distribute naloxone (most commonly a nasal spray that
reverses an opioid overdose within minutes) to persons
at risk of an opioid-related overdose. There are a lot of
protections for folks who give Naloxone, like the Good
Samaritan Law. The proposed procedure is to train
folks in the LMC community to distribute naloxone,
and they will be going over how to do so. The
Naloxone Distribution Project (NDP) is administered
by the state, the Department of Health Care Services
(DHCS) and provision of free naloxone. LMC is
partnering with Contra Costa Health Services (CCHS)
to offer education, etc. There will be a locked place to
store the Naloxone, training, and reporting the number
of doses of Naloxone distribution (which is required).
The next steps are to start scheduling training, ordering
Naloxone, and so on. The very next step is to go to
each Senate, as mentioned earlier, and take the
feedback to SGC. The SGC will then hopefully support
the procedure and get the plan started.
