3	Request for Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none">I. From Nick Garcia:<ul style="list-style-type: none">A. Re-capped the importance of KCACTF event and the need for financial support in order to make the trip successfulB. Emphasized that if LMCAS is willing to help pay for food and hotel rooms, they will include LMCAS as a co-sponsorC. President Cortez asked Guest Garcia if he could decide which item has a higher priority to which Guest Garcia responded, “hotel rooms.”D. Guest Ishola asked Guest Garcia whether the Drama Department had gone to any other organizations for help, to which Guest Garcia replied yes, “we have tried every resource possible.”E. Senator Serva brought up again what was off on the budget last week. Guest Garcia responded that there is a reprinted copy of the revised budget and re-calculated the costII. Motion to approve the \$6,252 as the amount of the hotel cost<ul style="list-style-type: none">A. Motioned by: Senator ServaB. Seconded by: Commissioner LeeC. Motion approved unanimously 4-0-0III. From Advisor Nguyen:<ul style="list-style-type: none">A. Went over rules for fundingB. Stated that there is \$4,450 left for LMCAS events Line Item 1C. Added that there is \$4,550 allocated to events Line Item 19D. In response to Commissioner Lee’s question about shifting each line item budget around, stated that there is \$8,000 allocated to Student Life which cannot be moved aroundE. Continued to go over what was allocated for certain events and what is left in the reservesF. Vice-President Garcia brought up the importance of the board anticipating other clubs requesting for money such as AGS. Asked Guest Garcia if it whether it would be fine if LMCAS

Guest Garcia said, “<i>any</i> help would be fine.” Vice-President Garcia turned to the board and stressed how LMCAS is undergoing a budget deficit and the need to avoid dipping into emergency funds</p> <p>G. Guest Ishola asked whether LMCAS if allowed to fundraise to which President Cortez responded that this is not permitted. “All funds come from student fees.”</p> <p>H. President Cortez further recommended to only fund for one thing such as \$2,800 for food</p> <p>I. Guest Ishola remarked on how Guest Garcia had gotten some of the funds from other resources, then asked what would happen if he were to use any extra money from the Drama Department itself Guest Garcia responded that to further dip into Drama Department’s funds takes away from putting on shows at the Little Theater, the California Theatre, etc.</p> <p>J. Guest Garcia repeatedly stressed how <i>any</i> money at all would help</p> <p>IV. Motion to amend the proposed amount from \$6,252 to \$2,275</p> <p>A. Motioned by: Commissioner Lee</p> <p>B. Seconded by: Senator Serva</p> <p>C. Discussion: The board went over the fiscal year and the amount for next year</p> <p>D. Discussion continued: Representative Satre brought up how accepting too much money may set up a precedent of other clubs not feeling valued. Guest Ishola disagreed with this statement and responded that the entire purpose of student government is to serve the students and that a first-come first-serve basis would not undervalue other students.</p> <p>E. President Cortez stepped in and stated that this is not exactly what student government is about and that it is, in fact, important to set a precedent because “this is what is going on. Hopefully the budget will increase anyway.” Stated that the board should aim to be wise about spending decisions</p> <p>F. Discussion continued: Vice-President Garcia said, “the reason why clubs come to us is because they see as special,” then further explained the need to “invest in our students and examine the outcome of funding this. Students can potentially get scholarships from schools they want to go to.” Provided anecdote of how she invests in her education despite working a</p>
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		<p>job she is not completely satisfied with. “This is not about funding for vacations. These are the students that have our name on the Aspen Award Prize [that Los Medanos College received.]”</p> <p>G. Dale wanted to add that although he does not have the voting right, he stressed how other clubs will be coming to us and hoped that keeping this in mind may influence the vote</p> <p>H. Guest Ishola expressed great appreciation toward Vice-President Garcia’s input because of “the long-term implications for the college.” President Cortez agreed to this and said that it directly aligns with what student body is about and how LMCAS advocates for student success</p> <p>I. Advisor Nguyen said if LMCAS approves this, “we will have \$2,225 left under Line item 19 (sponsored campus events).</p> <p>J. RC Kubota asked a question regarding the reserves. “If you do want to have another event this semester, would it make more sense to divide it into thirds?” Vice-President Garcia responded how in the previous semester, LMCAS worked out sponsorships with the City of Pittsburg</p> <p>K. Thought of crafting a draft of a letter to include sponsored textbooks at bookstore. ‘Andrew,’ an employee at the bookstore, said whatever LMCAS decides, “they will do the work of putting it on for us.”</p> <p>B. Senator Ishola asked a question specifying exactly which books would be laminated to which President Cortez responded, “whatever books we paid for, and it will be the most popular books that get paid for.”</p> <p>C. Guest Kubota inquired on what the goal of inserting sticker is. “To say we sponsored or to also to recruit people to LMCAS?” She added that a letter would be more effective than a sticker</p> <p>D. Senator Ishola said that there will always be some students who read it and some that will not read it</p> <p>E. President Cortez stressed that the board needs to come to a consensus on whether it will be a letter or a stamp</p> <p>F.
