What is Caring Campus?



Caring Campus was designed by the Institute for Evidence-Based Change (IEBC). IEBC is a nationally-recognized nonprofit organization that implements data-driven models to increase student success. The Caring Campus process provides new support for Classified Professional involvement in student success efforts. Caring Campus work recognizes and leverages the value of connectedness to dramatically increase the likelihood students will succeed in attaining their educational goals. If students don't feel connected to the college they attend, they are far less likely to return next term, regardless of the academic interventions and support services the college has provided. Caring Campus is designed to improve student success at colleges by coaching Classified Professionals to identify and commit to behaviors that increase students' sense of connectedness and belonging.

Who Got Caught Caring?

Who Got Caught Caring?






Her passion for education is evident in her work ethic- she describes her work as "a beautiful cycle of endless learning." She is proud to help form the next generation of leaders in the world while helping guide the current generation of emerging leaders and she learns from them daily.

Emmalee describes a time when she impacted and empowered her colleagues and student-teachers: "The most recent thing that I've done to help a student, was helping my current group of student-teachers to find their voice. Over the year, I was working on teaching the skill of assertiveness and boundaries when it comes to supporting children in the class... [for instance explaining what a boundary is, how to hold firm boundaries, and how to keep everyone in the room safe.] Beyond the classroom management, I made sure that the student-teachers were honest with what they wanted to say during personal. [We] would work through conversations that they were nervous to have with others, specifically helping them state their needs of the conversation. At the end of the year, these teachers shared with me how this affected their personal lives, and that they felt confident in speaking their true desires. I feel proud to be part of a cog in the people-pleasing wheel that many of us are stuck in, allowing my students to leave the program feeling confident in their own personal boundaries and confident to say what they need to say."

Outside of work, Emmalee enjoys game nights with friends and family, such as DND/Pathfinder, board games, card games, dominoes, etc. She also enjoys sharing meals and conversations with friends. Other than hanging out with friends, she likes to spend time with my family anywhere and everywhere.
