"Folk Dances" and "Ethnic Dance" commonly include styles such as African dance, Asian, Middle East (i.e. Belly Dance), Indian, Persian, Turkish dance and Native American Dance. These dances are not generally designed for public performance Rationale; or the stage, though may be later arranged and set for stage performances.
