This is being done because CTE faculty expressed that theyare working hard, and it is difficult for them to do all that is asked ofthem. Janice noted that only CTE programs are formally on watch.The task force will draft, deploy, and report the results of a Spring2022 survey of CTE faculty on this topic. Mark Lewis (AcademicSenate President) put out a call for the task force, which alreadyincludes Janice Townsend, Nicole Almassey, William Cruz, CindyMcGrath, and Marci Lapriore. Janice encouraged new faculty to joinbecause their perspective is appreciated. If interested in being part ofthe task force, please email Mark Lewis and members will beapproved by Academic Senate.Debra Hawkes informed the group that Nursing facilitated an openhouse organized by the counselors and Outreach team. There were100 student attendees. The purpose was to explain nursing and theprogram. LVN students answered questions of the participants. Thiswas a good way to reach a larger group of students and a differentaudience. Debra also mentioned that the nursing department is inthe process of the BRN (state Board of Registered Nursing) approval.

					Bill encouraged the group to take advantage of the outreach and marketing that can be done to highlight their programs/classes. The LMC Outreach Department can support with materials, information, and enrolling/registering for classes. More opportunities to come.
