Bankhead if you are interested.</li> <li>Noncredit programs that are in the works are the construction preapprenticeship, drone piloting, and FLOW (Forklift, Logistics, Operations, and Warehouse). These programs are one semester certificates. There is no tuition fee, but there might be course/materials fees. These programs are to launch Fall 2021. The Construction Math class (MATH- 009N) will start in Spring 2021.</li> <li>The development of noncredit programs is encouraged for all departments to consider. Beal is starting to do this for Business English- and would love discuss partnerships across CTE programs. C. Santana clarified that you need only 2 classes for noncredit certificate. College Success (COUNS-032N) and Intro to Career (COUNS-034N) are approved 27-hour courses that could pair with a discipline-specific noncredit course to create a noncredit certificate.

Santana have developed a spreadsheet called PTEC Tracker of which students have taken which classes. Industrial speakers present to students. He also asks Bill for help with summer internship program.</li> <li>F. Dorritie- classes are asynchronous, it is easy to disengage at the moment- until students realize that you can make up the classes but you can't make up the time. For example: 4 classes in a sequence and not offered at the same time. If students miss one, they have to wait an entire year. He is direct with his students about this.</li> <li>C. Corlew- he provides a page of classes and an inspirational video for students.</li> </ul>
