### How To Apply For Financial Aid

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at <a href="https://www.fafsa.gov">www.fafsa.gov</a>.
- ♦ Apply if you are a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- Have a valid Social Security Number and a high school diploma or GED.

### California Dream Act

- ♦ Allows AB540 eligible undocumented students to apply for state financial aid.
- - ♦ Students must meet all of the following criteria
    - ✓ Attended CA high school for at least 3 years.
    - ✓ Earned a CA high school diploma or equivalent
    - ✓ Submit the CA Non-resident Tuition Exemption Request form
    - ✓ Submit a copy of high school transcripts to the Admissions Office
- ♦ To Apply for state financial aid under the CA Dream Act, complete the Dream Act Application at <a href="https://www.caldreamact.org">www.caldreamact.org</a>.
- ♦ Application Timeline: Same as the FAFSA.
- Must Apply by the March 2<sup>nd</sup> Priority deadline for Cal Grant consideration!

## Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy

- ♦ <u>Academic:</u> maintain a semester and cumulative GPA of at least a 2.0.
- Progress: maintain a minimum pace of progression of at least 67% per semester, and cumulatively.
- Maximum Timeframe: must not have attempted more than 150% of the maximum units required for completion of academic program. Includes all prior coursework, plus all degree-applicable units from coursework completed at all prior institutions.

## Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy

#### ♦ Examples:

- ♦ Certificate Program of 30 units; the maximum timeframe to complete the program would be 45 attempted units.
- Associate Degree or Transfer Program of 60 units; the maximum timeframe to complete the program would be 90 attempted units.

## New State Grant Programs

\*CA College Promise Program

### Community College Completion Grant

- ♦ Intent: To increase grant aid to students, support persistence, retention and success by providing funds to students who are attending at a 15 unit per term pace or 30 unit per year pace.
- ♦ Annual Award Amount: \$1,500
- ♦ Must have a Comprehensive Education Plan that:

  - ♦ Identifies courses requirements the student must complete to earn the degree, certificate or transfer requirements.
- ♦ Eligibility Requirements
  - ♦ Must be a Cal Grant B or C Award recipient at full-time enrollment
  - ♦ Must be a Full-Time Student Success Grant award recipient
  - ♦ Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0, unless first time student
  - ♦ Have a comprehensive student education plan

## One-time Emergency Aid Funding for Dreamer students

- Provides emergency aid to students with an identified need
- ♦ Must be AB540 eligible
- ♦ Must complete the CA Dream Act Application
- ♦ Annual Award Amounts: TBD

## CA College Promise Program

- different from the CA College Promise Grant (formerly known as the BOGW).
- Legislation passed, but funding is not available to colleges yet.
- Colleges need to apply for funding if interested.
- If funding is granted, colleges can use funds to pay for the first year of tuition for first-time, full-time enrolled students or support other activities.

## Scholarships

- ♦ 2018-2019 LMC Foundation Scholarship Cycle: November 2017 through February 9, 2018.
- ♦ To apply, students must be: a current or transferring student, min. GPA of 2.0
- Eligibility criteria of each scholarship is determined by the Donor, such as:
  - ♦ Academic achievements
  - ♦ Financial need
  - ♦ Extracurricular activities
- ♦ Apply through the Online LMC Scholarship Application portal.
  - ♦ Apply for all LMC scholarships with a single online application
  - Auto-match feature will match student's application with the scholarships for which they meet the minimum criteria.
