# Common Course Numbering Phase II Fall Convenings and Survey Opportunities

Greetings Faculty,

With the fall semester underway, the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) remains committed to advocating and supporting faculty involvement and input as we embark on the second phase of creating Common Course Numbering (CCN) Course Templates.

# **Faculty Convenings**

To ensure faculty input, we are hosting three virtual CCN faculty events to

address 23 courses across 12 disciplines and have invited Academic Senate Presidents at all California Community Colleges to nominate up to two faculty members per discipline to participate in CCN Faculty Workgroups (CCNFWs) during the following multi-day convenings. Please note that while we value all nominations, not all nominated faculty may be selected for the final composition of the 12-member workgroups. In addition, the ASCCC has invited our intersegmental partners to appoint faculty to participate in these convenings as intersegmental partner collaboration related to CCN discussions supports the groundwork for successful implementation.

Selected CCNFW members, working with intersegmental faculty from across the state, will review survey data received from faculty-at-large with the goal of creating finalized Phase II CCN Course Templates for the next round of high-enrollment general education courses. Unlike the Phase I summer convenings, in most cases, faculty will develop templates for multiple courses in a discipline.

Participating faculty members will be expected to attend each day of the multi-day discipline-specific CCN virtual event. The ASCCC will provide faculty participants with a \$150 stipend for each CCN Course Template created within the discipline-specific CCNFW with funding provided by the CCC Chancellor's Office.

### **Survey Opportunity**

Please note that while the number of faculty participating in these events is limited, faculty-at-large have an opportunity to provide feedback in the CCN process through pre-development and post-development surveys for each of the identified CCN courses to help shape the fall convening discussions and outcomes. The first pre-development surveys are now available for History, English, Economics, and Art History CCN Course Templates. Survey responses must be received by **Sunday, October 6th**.
