NS: Natural Sciences (3 units)


AH: Arts and Humanities (3 units)




Title 5 Changes (Local Degree GE Patterns)

Title 5 <u>55061</u>

21 semester units' minimum (begins 2025 academic year)

- 1A = English Composition; 1 course
- 1B = Oral Communication and Critical Thinking; 1 course
- 2 = Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning; 1 course
- 3 = Arts and Humanities; 1 course
- 4 = Social and Behavioral Sciences; 1 course
- 5 = Natural Sciences; 1 course
- 6 = Ethnic Studies; 1 course





Changes between Current and New Local GE Patterns

- 1. EM (Ethnic and Multicultural Studies Box): This is replaced with just an Ethnic Studies box (causing a shift to multicultural courses or other diverse perspective classes that are not considered Ethnic Studies)
- 2. Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning is its own GE box.
- 3. Hence, the increase from 18-units to 21-units is caused by math having its own GE requirement.

CalGETC Changes

The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is the singular general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements necessary for **transfer** and admission to both the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC).

34 semester units' minimum.

- 1A = English Composition; 1 course
- 1B = Critical Thinking and Composition; 1 course
- 1C = Oral Communication; 1 course
- 2 = Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning; 1 course
- 3 = Arts and Humanities; 2 courses, one in each area
- 4 = Social & Behavioral Sciences; 2 courses from different disciplines
- 5 = Physical and Biological Sciences; 2 courses (one with lab)
- 6 = Ethnic Studies; 1 course



Importance of General Education for Students

- Exposure to a breadth of courses and ideas
- •Knowledge and skill attainment in a breadth of topics
- Transferable and foundational skills
- Critical thinking
- Written and oral communication
- Methods of inquiry
- Cultural understanding and appreciation
- •Foundations for civic participation
- •Exposure to new courses, topics, and ideas

Suggestions for Displaced EM Courses

- Include in local GE requirements
- Include as local graduation requirement
- Remember: applies to local degrees only, not ADTs
- Advocate for use of elective units
- Utilize noncredit courses
- Promote lifelong learning courses and opportunities
- Analyze and promote efficacy of lifelong learning and self-development courses



Other Community College Districts

- LACCD (Los Angeles Community College District): Local GE pattern is 27 units.
 - o They opted to maintain Lifelong Learning and American Institutions.
- LRCCD (Los Rios Community College District): Local GE pattern is 24 units.
- They opted to keep their Living Skills category.
- Many Community College Districts are aligning their local GE to maintain values and highlight courses that are being left behind by CalGETC (common transfer pattern).



Diverse Perspectives



The GE committee proposes an option for local GE requirements: Diverse Perspectives (24-unit minimum for local GE)

- Maintains our diverse perspectives, which the college implemented in the 1990's.
- Allows/encourages disciplines to place multicultural and diverse courses in this box (such as our LGBTQ+ courses).
- Will not increase total units for degrees as most LMC local degrees have GE electives that these 3-units will use.
