1. Who are the students we serve now and who will our future students be?
 - Goal – a living wage! – we need to backwards map to support the learning goals of the future.
 - Technology is central
 - Equity and access gaps
 - Computer literacy and equity gaps → digital divide (How do we bridge these gaps?)
 - Tech savvy – now and future → students will need more specific technology training to keep up
 - K-12 students should be trained with technology because many of them won't understand or many get left behind when they get to higher education levels. The industry should work with K-12 so students will be more successful.
 - Consider rapidly changing technologies
 - Students now define technology as their phones – they will do more things on their phones (school work, applications, etc.)
 - Dual enrollment in high school and college
 - Career retraining and/or career advancement
 - Continuing education for older adults
 - As a mother of a student with a IEP, I see more and more special needs students going the direction of college. I'd like to see more accommodations for these students.
 - Needs are soft skills – and training for data driven critical thinking jobs
 - Changing demographics
 - More people coming from more expensive areas
 - Consider cultural needs as there is more diversity
2. What are the needs of our current students and what will students' needs be in the future?
 - The needs as far as food and housing security seem to be increasing. It's very challenging to focus on education when those needs are not met.
 - Need more accessible online courses
 - Students will either be working individuals/parents with conflicting schedules to the offered classes on-campus.
 - More supports – different kinds for different purposes
 - Current generation lacks independency and functioning
 - Some websites can be overwhelming for them
 - We need to guide students in picking classes and planning
 - Deal with complexities
 - Address “competition” for limited “spaces” – impacted classes → virtual college CCCCCO

3. Do our current delivery systems serve student needs?
 - Offer more workforce ready fields of degrees
 - Look into offering BA/BS degrees (ex. Solano CC)
 - Student Retention, school/academic counseling support many classes start with 30 and end with 20
 - Many classes start with 30 and end with 20 → teacher training in instruction on needs to improve
 - How do we tie-in student success to adult success and vice versa?
 - We have to stop assuming victimology, stop lowering standard by ethnicity because to do so is insulting.
 - We need to have high standards and expectations for all students.
 - Mentorships
 - Scaffolded learning and opportunities.

4. How can we best serve the educational needs of the population in our service area?
 - Responsive and agile to student needs
 - Know of economics of area
 - Understanding “cultural” differences
 - Increase Rigor
 - Help students more toward educational rigor
 - Improve instruction to reach students
 - Increase access to tools and resources for effective learning, effective studying; analytic thinking, reading and presentations
 - Raise faculty and staff expectations of students
 - Reinforce those expectations
 - Create a learning environment to focus more on individual student needs
 - Lecture series at tielogy
 - Distance/online education
 - A wider diversity of trade education
 - Cafeteria-state courses offering leading to different career paths
 - Helping to support student staging in school

5. What technologies, facilities, and practices will best ensure equitable outcomes for our students?
 - User-friendly website
 - Look at entrepreneurial options within career/technical training that allow students to develop their own businesses

- Ex) Renaissance (S.F.) – help people start new businesses
 - “Hackathons”
- Free computers, Wi-Fi, and space for whenever they come
- Ensure that we don’t have “best kept secrets
