Getting to this point: Arranging the marriage

- Funds administered by CDE
 - \$15M SB 1070/SB 70
 - \$500M Career Pathway Trust Grant
 - \$900M CTE Incentive Fund
- Fund Administered by CCCCCO
 - \$48M SB 1070/SB 70
 - \$50 CTE Enhancement Fund
 - \$248M Strong Workforce Funds



LMC SWP- Initial investments

LMC's SWP: \$2,808,156 (first two rounds)

**Third round: \$1,438,141
(July 1, 2018-December 31, 2020)**

Fourth round: \$300 Million to K-12 for CE



LMC Investments: Existing & New Programs

 - Career Center Specialist (Cooperative Work Experience)
 - Public Safety Coordinator (50%- program expansion)

 - 1 Dean
 - 1 Special Programs Manager



Time to get married for \$164M!

- \$150 administered through CCCCO Regional Consortia in partnership with CDE
- \$14M direct to colleges for Pathway Connectors/Liaisons
- Bay Area Consortium: \$29,422,144
- Competitive process- must partner with Community College(s)
- Letters of Intent due in NOVA by 1/4/18 (placeholder- can be amended)
- Colleges are working on draft letters of support
