What are ISLOs?

Institution-Level Student Learning Outcomes (ISLOs) are the Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) that Los Medanos College has defined at the institutional level. The ISLOs identify the most important, general skills that students who receive a degree should acquire while attending Los Medanos College (LMC).

ISLOs are intended to identify:

- Los Medanos College's expectations of itself and its graduates;
- General skills that degree recipients will obtain through the course of their studies;
- General skills that students will obtain as a result of completing the General Education patterns;
- Building blocks that contribute to attainment of the general skill areas; and
- A common set of goals across courses, programs, and services.

Students who receive a degree from Los Medanos College will demonstrate the following (ACCJC Standards 2.A.11):

- Critical Thinking & Quantitative Competency
- Global Awareness & Civic Responsibility
- 4. Personal, Academic, and Career Development (other program-specific learning outcomes)




