
Q1 What do you consider to be Los Medanos College's most valuable strengths? (select your top five responses)



Q2 What opportunities would help Los Medanos College achieve greater success over the next five years? (select your top four responses)



Q3 What should Los Medanos College seek to accomplish or aspire to over the next five years? (select your top four responses)




Q4 What should LMC strive to be known for in the future? (select your top three responses)


Q5 How should LMC determine if it has achieved its desired outcomes? (select your top four responses)



Q6 Which constituency group do you belong to for your primary role at/connection to the College? (select one)




