

## LMC STUDENT SURVEYS

WHAT CAN WE DO TO SUPPORT OUR STUDENTS?

5.19.2020

### **OBJECTIVE**

To deeper understand LMC students' needs during COVID-19 and provide focused support to students via interview and survey.

### **PROCESS**

On April 17, 2020, the district research in collaboration with 3 colleges developed one interview questionnaire and one survey to gauge students' current needs and future needs.

The telephone interview was conducted by 14 classified professionals who volunteered to support this task. About 700 students had been identified who dropped one or more classes after March 16. The interviewers had been training, scribes had been provided, and data had been entered. About 200 students responded to the interview from April 27 to May 13.

The survey for resource needs was sent via District communication platform on April 27 and closed on May 13 to about 9772+ students who enrolled in spring 2020.

### **FINDINGS**

- 1. Majority of the students indicated that they are getting enough information from the college.
- 2. Students are stressed out and cannot concentrate.
- 3. Many students just don't like online education (or just don't have the time now).
- 4. Not all students feel engaged in an online environment: from ADHD, to the effectiveness of their faculty in translating the in person experience, to engaging with the screen so much (headaches), many felt it was just too hard.
- 5. A significant number of students were disappointed with online faculty instruction/communication.
- 6. Financial need persists and impacts in many ways.
- 7. Most students have access to technology, but some still don't.
- 8. Students miss connecting with the campus and our staff and appreciated the call from LMC.
- 9. Students reported difficulty finding resources online.
- 10. Having a good study environment was challenging for many.
- 11. Students are searching for: quiet, a place to focus and study, internet.
- 12. Majority of students feel prepare or somewhat prepare to continue online during summer or fall semester.




Students who dropped one or more courses

Q3 Are you currently experiencing challenges or barriers in meeting your basic needs?(Check all that apply)











## Q3 What method do you prefer to get your information? (Check all that apply)





## Q5 Are you experiencing difficulties or barriers meeting your basic needs? (check all that apply)




