LMC/4CD Policy Updates Regarding Gender Identity, Name Changes, and Student Data Privacy



Key Policies

- ▶ BP 3013 Student Records, Directory Information, and Privacy
- ▶ SS 3026 Student Records & Directory Information

Gender Identity and Affirmed Names

- Currents students can declare an affirmed name and gender identity in records where legal names are not required.
- ▶ Former students may have their records updated.
- Records include Student ID Cards, class rosters, transcripts, and diplomas.

Protecting the Privacy of Student Information

- ► FERPA: Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act
- Only directory information may be shared without permission
- ▶ Upcoming Changes will enhance the privacy of student information

Directory Information

Modified Language (BP 3013 & SS 3026)

- student name;
- student participation in officially recognized activities and sports including weight, height and high school of graduation of athletic team members; and
- degrees and awards received by students, including honors, scholarship awards, athletic awards and Dean's List recognition.

Options for Student Documentation

Added Language (SS 3026)

▶ Unless required by federal or state law, the District will not inquire specifically about a student's citizenship or immigration status or that of their parents or guardians. Whenever possible, the District will use alternative acceptable documents or information instead of requesting documentation or information that could reveal a student's immigration status, such as a permanent resident card, voter registration, passport, or citizenship papers.



4CD Trans Athletes and 3C2A Guidelines

- California Community Colleges Athletic Association Response to Executive Order
 - > Marty Storti, Athletic Director
 - > Dr. Tanisha Maxwell, Vice President of Student Services

3C2A has not accepted the EO directive barring trans athletes.

The Association is reviewing requirements. Until that changes, community college trans athletes are eligible to compete in their appropriate sport based on their gender identity.

How You Can Support

- ▶ Familiarize yourself with the updated policies.
- Direct students to Admissions & Records for assistance.
- Respect and use students' affirmed names and pronouns.
- ▶ Ensure data privacy and prevent unauthorized disclosure of information.

EMPLOYEE PROTOCOLS FOR **IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT (ICE)** ON CAMPUS

Remain calm and professional

- Maintain a calm and professional demeanor if approached by an ICE officer.
- . Inform the officer that you are required to follow the college's protocol for such requests.

Do not disclose information

- . Do not provide any student information, such as enrollment status, class schedules, or personal details.
- . Inform the officer that "per college policy all requests for student information must go through the Office of the President."

Guide the officer to the Office of the President

- . Escort the officer to the Office of the President stating, "I will guide you to the appropriate office." If you are at the Brentwood Center, escort the officer to the Dean's Office.
- If after hours, call the president at extension 925-473-7301, and call LMC Police Services, 925-473-7332. They will find the college president or a designee to respond

Allow the Office of the President to handle the request

. The president will consult with the chancellor, who will seek legal counsel to determine the appropriate response to a request. 4CD's legal counsel advises on compliance with valid court orders, subpoenas, or warrants.

Maintain confidentiality

- . Do not share personal information or confidential details about students or employees with anyone other than personnel in the Office of the President.
- Student information is protected under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and California
- . The president will communicate with campus about ICE activity as appropriate.

Document

. The president may request you to document the interaction with ICE. Include the date, time, location, and a summary of what occurred. Submit this summary to the president for record-keeping.

Please consider adding your campus police phone number to your phone contacts list.
